Truck 1 was out of service due to a problem with the starter. We 'd like to give Special Recognition to Joe Rzepka and his family members who replaced the starter on their own time (approx. 1.5 days labor) saving the Village a significant amount of money.

All the front-line pumps passed the annual service test. Engine 2 Reserve did not pass due to an overheating problem which we will investigate.

Training

Our Fire Department Co. Inc. purchased a Learning Management System from Vector Solutions which should help improve our training program. There is a significant amount of groundwork to do before the system is fully implemented but it will be beneficial in the long run.

Special Note

We had some difficulty extinguishing what should have been a routine fire in a pile of brush this past month. Post-fire investigation suggests there may have been lithium-ion batteries within the brush that started the fire and contributed to the intensity of the flames. Highway personnel should watch for discarded batteries in trash and other piles along the road. Everyone should be aware of the danger of mishandling these batteries and should use the proper disposal practices.
